Moving with Houseplants Checklist

2-3 Weeks Before Moving

Assessment and Preparation
Inspect all plants for pests and diseases
☐ If necessary, treat plants for pests
Decide which plants to take and which to leave behind or give away
☐ Photograph valuable plants for insurance and identification purposes
Research climate conditions of your new location
☐ Prepare space in vehicle for safe transportation
Legal Considerations
Research plant transportation regulations in your region/country
Check restrictions on bringing plants into new area
☐ Obtain necessary documents/certificates (for interstate or international moves)
One Week Before Moving
Plant Preparation
☐ Stop fertilizing plants one week before moving
Trim dry and damaged leaves and branches
☐ Tie up long stems and branches
☐ Remove plants from windowsills and place in less bright location
Purchase Materials
☐ Cardboard boxes in various sizes
Bubble wrap, newspapers, bags, soft fabric for wrapping pots
☐ Tape, labels, and markers for plant identification
I-2 Days Before Moving
Natering and Packing Preparation
☐ Water plants moderately (soil should be slightly moist, not wet)
☐ Allow excess water to drain from saucers
Secure pots with plastic wrap or paper so soil doesn't spill
Prepare labels with plant names and care instructions
Moving Day
Plant Packing
☐ Pack plants last
☐ Wrap each plant in newspaper or bubble wrap
Place plants in boxes with ventilation holes
Secure nots so they don't move around

Moving with Houseplants Checklist

☐ Mark boxes as 'FRAGILE PLANTS'☐ Use supports and ties for tall plants
Transportation
 □ Transport plants in car cabin, not trunk □ Avoid sharp turns and sudden braking □ Protect plants from direct sunlight and drafts □ Maintain moderate temperature in vehicle
Immediately After Moving
Placement in New Home
☐ Unpack plants first
Place plants in shaded area for several days
Check condition of roots and soil
☐ Remove damaged leaves and stems
Initial Care
☐ Don't water plants immediately - let them adapt for 1-2 days
☐ Don't fertilize plants for first 2-3 weeks
☐ Maintain regular watering schedule and air humidity
☐ Gradually acclimate plants to new lighting conditions
First Weeks After Moving
Adaptation and Care
☐ Gradually move plants to permanent locations
Watch for signs of stress (wilting, leaf drop)
If necessary, repot plants in fresh soil
☐ Resume normal watering and feeding schedule after 2-3 weeks
Long-term Measures
Find local plant stores and nurseries
Learn about local climate considerations for plant care
☐ If needed, purchase additional lighting or humidifiers
Special Recommendations
Large Plants
Consider temporary pruning for easier transportation
Use cart or helpers for moving
☐ Measure doorways and stairwells in advance

Moving with Houseplants Checklist

 Don't water for a week before moving Wrap spiny plants in thick paper or cloth These plants handle moves better than others
Delicate Tropical Plants
☐ Minimize transportation time
☐ Maintain stable temperature
☐ Provide high humidity in box
Safety
☐ Position plants so they don't block walkways or risk falling
☐ Check pot stability, especially for tall plants
☐ Consider toxic plants if you have pets or children
